Let me take this opportunity to first thank you for all of your continued support. HCAS had another successful year supporting the Howard County autism community. From our social events to our awareness and advocacy efforts, we hope we were able to play a small part in making your lives a little better. Of course, if we helped to create a memory with your friends and family, all the better. HCAS was honored to be recognized by the Howard County Commission of Disability Issues in October of 2016 when County Executive, Allan Kittleman, presented HCAS a Service Award. - Held our annual special needs camp fair providing information on summer camp opportunities.
- Held monthly meetings of the various support groups including the Asperger's Group, Transition and Adulthood Group and general HCAS support group. These meetings often included guest speakers on a variety of topics of interest to the community.
- Continued execution of our Family Advocacy and Parent Education (FAPE) Grant, offering assistance to those with questions and issues surrounding the school system
- Held FAPE conference co-sponsored by Howard County Public School System (HCPSS) and RISE for Autism.
- Continued updating our Special Education News Center with information and articles pertinent to special education advocacy and support.
- Transitioned to the HCAS *monthly* eNewsletter, Perspectives
- Held Brown Bag Series workshops in partnership with Pathfinders for Autism
- Sponsored a BE SAFE training workshop attended by HC Police recruits and self-advocates.
- Provided state-mandated autism training to new recruit classes of the HC Police Department.
- Held meetings with HCPSS Department of Special Education and Student Services leadership to continue work on improving the services and opportunities for those on the spectrum.
- Completed the Middle School Workgroup, a 2+ year effort focused on improving the educational experience of those in middle school.
- Implemented 'The Lions' Den'; a "Best Buddies" like program at Murray Hill Middle School. Program still going strong with solid administration support. Looking for opportunities to spread within HCPSS.
- Participated on the HCPSS Diversity and Inclusion Committee which provided a set of recommendations to expand programs promoting positive behavior, and respect.
- Jointly organized the 2016 Board of Education Primary Election Candidates Forum on special education with SECAC and The Arc of Howard County.
- Continued our work with HCPSS, Howard County Recreation and Parks and Howard County Department of Citizens Services on the Transition Outreach Partnership to increase outreach, programming and support of our children transitioning out of the school system in Howard County.
- Through the work of our Housing Subcommittee, conducted a feasibility study for a potential housing solution for those on the spectrum in Howard County which culminated in a Discovery Workshop in October 2016 which was attended by State and local authorities as well as developers and financers in the industry.
