Social Events held in 2015:

- Trips to Great Wolf Lodge and Snow Tubing at Liberty Mountain
- Restaurant fundraising nights

General HCAS Activities from 2015:

- Held our 10th annual Pieces of the Puzzle Gala
- Held our 9th annual One Step Closer ... Autism Walk and 5K Run
- Held our 2nd annual Transition Symposium, providing a full day of presenters and workshops covering a wide variety of Transition topic.s
- Held our annual camp fair providing information on summer camp opportunities for those with special needs.
- Established the Middle School Autism Workgroup, co-chaired by HCAS and HCPSS, to evaluate issues and opportunities to improve the middle school experience for students with autism. The workgroup includes administrators, instructional facilitators, resource teachers, instructional team leaders and parents.
- Held monthly meetings of the various support groups including the Asperger's Group, Transition and Adulthood Group and general HCAS support group. These meetings often included guest speakers on a variety of topics of interest to the community.
- Continued execution of our Family Advocacy and Parent Education (FAPE) Grant, offering assistance to those with questions and issues surrounding the school system
- Held FAPE conference co-sponsored by Howard County Public School System (HCPSS) and RISE for Autism
- Held four Brown Bag Series workshops in partnership with Pathfinders for Autism
- Provided state-mandated autism training to new recruit classes of the Howard County Police Department.
- Held meetings with HCPSS Department of Special Education and Student Services (DSESS) leadership to continue work on improving the services and opportunities for those on the spectrum.
- Continued updating our Special Education News Center with information and articles pertinent to special education advocacy and support.
- Expanded our social skills/opportunities program by adding an 11-15 age group. Both age groups (11-15; 16-23) met throughout 2015 and already have sessions scheduled in 2016.
- Partnered with HCPSS, Howard County Recreation and Parks and Howard County Department of Citizens Services to form the Transition Outreach Partnership with the goal to increase outreach, programming and support of our children transitioning out of the school system in Howard County.
- Through the work of our Housing Subcommittee, completed initial research into future housing solutions for those on the spectrum in Howard County. A smaller housing 'workgroup' is now continuing with efforts to push forward with the potential housing options that have been identified.
